2016 Fossil Collecting

Sunday, Mar 13

I'm back....

Saturday was the nicest day of the year so far, with sunny skies and temperatures nearing twenty degrees, so naturally, I'm stuck at home because my wife made other plans. This meant that Sunday was my "opening day" at my usual quarry. Due to the time change, I arrived at the quarry late (for me), at about 7:45 and sure enough, there had been others there the day before as evidenced by their waivers in the mailbox. I get to pick through the leftovers.

My plan was to walk around the upper levels and see what, if anything, had eroded out over the "winter that wasn't". The pickings were pretty slim to say the least. The first thing I kept was a rusophycus. This is a trilobite

resting trace fossil. The trilobite would have been on the opposite side of the fossil and as it sat and moved its legs, it created what looks, to me anyway, like a pair of bananas sitting side by side. The likely culprit for this rusophycus is a Flexicalymene due to their abundance, but it could have come from any of several similar sized bugs found at the site.

The quarry was understandably very muddy, and as I headed toward the north wall, I

saw no fresh footprints so my hopes were raised a bit that the area wasn't cleaned out before I got there. As I continued around, I picked up a couple of common pieces -more because they were in near perfect shape than anything. I saw a couple of damaged trilobites that stayed where they were, but nothing fantastic was showing itself. With the wind really picking up, it took quite a while before I found anything that would salvage my trip. At the last corner before the newer area, I finally found my prize of the day. Centered on a small slab of yellowed limestone was a good sized Isorophusella incondita edrioasteroid with a smaller juvenile specimen nearby. Think of these creatures as "seated starfish". It looks as though one of the arms has disarticulated, but the rest is quite nice, and these are always a welcomed find. The large one is slightly smaller than a nickel in diameter.

A walk along the road one level down from here proved fruitless, as did a quick climb on the mountain. It was too wet and mushy, so one trip up and back down was enough for me. The wind gusts up there weren't helping either. Rather than go to the bottom pit and start splitting rock, I called it a day. The bottom will be my focus next time out when I can spend a full day down there.

Please do not be late for the sign-in...... late comers will not be allowed on site.

Young Collectors: you must be 16 years of age or older and accompanied by an adult.

You NEED a current KRFC Club membership card OR a current CLUB CARD associated with the CCFMS and government issued photo I.D. to be able to sign in.

Full safety gear must be worn at all times while on site and at sign in.

Long pants must be worn, no shorts!

Entry fee of \$10 as a donation to the Bancroft Gem & Mineral Club museum.

No power tools or micro-blasters.

Absolutely no selling of specimens collected. This is most important as AECON has made numerous complaints about the selling of specimens collected from the site. AECON is very supportive of collecting for education and study and we need to respect their position.

Try and stay as long as possible. The more interest and use of the site we can show the more chance there will be of AECON keeping the site open to collectors.

If we stick with the new rules we might be rewarded by AECON keeping this outstanding collecting site open to CCFMS member clubs.
